For style of decoration *cf.* May, Silchester, XXV, 26.

Pottery: La Graufesenque. Late 1st Cent. A.D. (*See* Plate IX.)

- 170-Dr. 37. Bright, hard glaze. Lower band of decoration; row of S-shaped ornament bordered above by zig-zag line ending in rosette; *cf.* Walters, B.M. Cat. M. 44, M. 555, and May, Silchester, XXV, 7 (Mercato bowl), assigned to Domitian's reign. *See* also Wroxeter 1912, XIV, 5 (75-100 A.D.), and Gellygaer, pl. XIII, 6 (till early Hadrian). South Gaulish.
- 171-Dr. 37. Fitting No. 166, q.v.
- 172-Dr. 37. (Three pieces) similar Ovolo to No. 168. Decoration in sub-divided panels.
Left side: Two long narrow panels. Upper one: Lion couchant l., nearly Déch. 752 (Lezoux).
Lower one: Two semi-circles, side by side, suspended by billets to uprights, and containing, left one a spiral, right one a bird, nearly the reverse of Déch. 1036 (Lez.). Right side: Upper panel: Small bear r. (May, Silchester, XXV, 22) and small bear l., Déch. 820 (Lez.). Between them a plant.
Lower panel: Dog running r., Déch. 916 bis (Malcio, La Grauf.).
Pottery: South Gaulish (Montans?). Date: Domitian-Trajan.
- 173-Dr. 37. (Small) Scroll pattern. In upper lobe, spiral with star centre. In lower lobe: Two sceptre-head blossoms attached to similar but larger motif by looped stalks; *cf.* May, Tullie Ho. Cat. II, 12, and Curle, Newstead, p. 213, 1 and 3, 80-100 A.D.
La Graufesenque. Flavian, prob. Domitianic.
- 174-Dr. 37. Two zones of decoration below ovolo with three-pronged tassel. In upper zone: Hare running r., Déch. 942 (La Grauf. and Lez.) over fan-shaped tuft of grass (May, Silchester, XXV, 6, 7, on Mercato bowls), La Graufesenque. Domitian.
- 175-Dr. 37. (Very thick frag^t with part of foot-ring). Three-leaved plant on base (May, Silchester, XXV, 4, on *Ofi Sacri* bowl, Lez.): Lion bounding r.; *cf.* Déch. 750 Lez. Lezoux. Trajan-Hadrian.
- 176-Dr. 37. (Thick). Lower edge of decoration. Swan or Nile goose r., Déch., 1017. Below: beaded line and wreath of three leaves; *cf.* (May, Silchester, XIXB). South Gaulish. Domitian-Trajan.
- 177-Dr. 37. Free Style. Hind quarters of lioness (?) l.; *cf.* Déch., 795 (Lez.). In field "crown" ornament or comb pattern, as in Walters B.M. Cat. M. 1514, Déch., 570, and Wroxeter, 1914, XXIV. 7. Early Lezoux or East Gaul. Early 2nd Cent. A.D.
