 lessfull money of England a peice being in all Ten pounds To be
 paid to them by my Executors hereafter named when they shall severally
 attaine To the severall age of one and Twenty years or day of marriage
 that shall first happen And in case either or any of them the said
 Children shall happen to dye or depart this life before they shall attaine
 to the said age of one and Twenty years or day of marriage that shall
 first happen as aforesaid Then my will is That the portion of her-
 or them so dying shall be equally divided between the Survivors of
 them by my Executors hereafter named All the Rest of my goods
 Cattle Chattels Utensils and household stuffe as well movable as en-
 gynnovable not before by me bequeathed My debts and funerals Expences
 being first paid and discharged I give and bequeath unto my Loving
 wife Jane Fisher who I doe here by ordaine constitute and appoint to
 be sole and whole Executrix of this my last will and Testament and
 to see the same in all points performed In witness whereof I have
 hereunto sett my hand and seal the day and yeare first above
 written Thomas Fisher / Signed sealed published and declared by
 the said Thomas Fisher to be his last will and Testament in the
 presence of Thomas Eltham William Scarning Watkin Nicholas /
